

HOUSE GUIDELINES FOR RESTAURANTS WITH LIMITED LIQUOR LICENSES

- Never serve an intoxicated person any alcohol, understand what intoxication means
- Never allow an intoxicated person to drive a vehicle
- Don't over serve alcohol - Obey all state and local laws concerning alcohol
- I. D. - customers under 21 years of age can not drink or purchase alcohol
- Alcohol may be purchased only with a meal that is consumed on the premise - No alcohol with take-out orders - No alcohol may be purchased to go
- A limited restaurant licensee may not sell, serve, or allow consumption of spirituous liquor on the premises of the restaurant
- If the proprietor allows a guest to "brown bag" bottle finished wine into the restaurant and the guest does not drink all their wine, the wine can be recapped or recorked and the guest can remove the wine. Also, if guests buy a bottle of wine with their meal and the wine is opened and served, but they do not finish drinking all the wine, the wine can be recapped or recorked and removed from the restaurant
- If wine is removed from the restaurant the server should always remind the guest to place the opened bottle of wine in the trunk of their vehicle, open containers of alcoholic beverages in the passenger compartment of a vehicle are a violation of state law
- Beer sold shall be in a size of container that does not exceed two liters, except that beer may not be sold to an individual patron in a size of container that exceeds one liter
- A customer may have two alcoholic beverages in front of them at a time
- A patron may only consume alcohol at or near their table
- Record and report all alcohol related incidents
- All employees should cooperate with each other and with management
- Always wear a proper name badge
- Never consume or be under the influence of alcohol while on duty
- Be a professional at all times in the service of alcohol and other responsibilities
