

HOUSE GUIDELINES FOR RESTAURANTS WITH FULL SERVICE LIQUOR LICENSES

- Never serve an intoxicated person any alcohol, understand what intoxication means. Understand and be able to recognize early signs of potential intoxication. Never over serve alcohol to anyone.
- Never allow an intoxicated person to drive a vehicle. Offer alternate means of transportation.
- I. D. - customers under 21 years of age can not drink or purchase alcohol.
- Alcohol may be purchased only with a meal that is consumed on the premise - No alcohol with take-out orders. No alcohol may be purchased to go.
- If the proprietor allows a guest to “brown bag” bottle finished wine into the restaurant and the guest does not drink all their wine, the wine can be recapped or recorked and the guest can remove the wine. Also, if guests buy a bottle of wine with their meal and the wine is opened and served, but they do not finish drinking all the wine, the wine can be recapped or recorked and removed from the restaurant. Make sure the wine that is “brown bagged” has a DABC sticker on the bottle.
- If wine is removed from the restaurant the server should always remind the guest to place the opened bottle of wine in the trunk of their vehicle, open containers of alcoholic beverages in the passenger compartment of a vehicle are a violation of state law.
- A customer may have only one “spirituous” liquor beverage in front of them at a time but may have two alcoholic beverages in front of them at one time.
- Liquor sales, that is any alcohol over 3.2% by weight, are allowed from noon to midnight.
- Beer sold shall be in a size of container that does not exceed two liters, except that beer may not be sold to an individual patron in a size of container that exceeds one liter.
- Beer sales are allowed from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm
- A patron may only consume alcohol at or near their table.
- Record all alcohol related incidents and report them to a manager or owner as soon as possible.
- All employees should cooperate with each other and with management.
- Obey all state and local laws concerning alcohol.
- Always wear a proper name badge.
- Never consume or be under the influence of alcohol while on duty.
- Be a professional at all times in the service of alcohol and other responsibilities.
